<u>Chair Report – Megan Johnson</u>

Projects Funded by PAC. PAC has funded wonderful programs this year, including:

<u>Vaisakhi – Samosas.</u> PAC was proud to support Laronde's celebration of Vaisakhi on April 14th providing a samosa for each child. PAC will continue to contribute to the cultural enrichment and education of our kids and to recognize the very important cultural celebrations and events occurring throughout the year through food, art, music, dance, and literature.

<u>Body Health Presentations</u> – PAC sponsored the Body Health sessions presented by Saleema Noon in addition to paying for access to the content before the presentations in the classrooms. PAC hopes that by providing access to the videos, parents felt better informed and equipped to make decisions about their children(s)' participation.

<u>Unique Minds Science Workshop:</u> Unique Minds came to Laronde to give Science workshops to our students on topics such as space, machines, properties of light and sound, meteorology, and water. This was a great way for students to be exposed to some fun Science projects and learning and the teachers have the chance to see the interactions of students in their grade groups. This was funded by PAC's Science Enhancement Funds.

<u>Saltwater Studios Art Program</u>: PAC supported Johanne Howard from Saltwater Studios to come do workshops with our students.

<u>Think Yourself for Kids Academy - Yoga week K-7:</u> This program was provided to the kids to promote physical literacy, self-esteem, and confidence. Ask your child about their experience! https://thinkyourself.com/school-kids-programs/

(4) MOSAIC) PAC was thrilled to fund this important presentation by MOSAIC Centre for Diversity that focuses on building a school environment based on respect, equity, inclusion, and diversity. In the

assembly, students explored ways people are different from each other, including racial and cultural differences; understand the meaning and negative impact of racism; and to understand and learn to recognize the signs and negative impact of racism.

(5) <u>Technology (iPads)</u> – PAC supplied the school with <u>11 iPads</u> to meet the remaining needs for technology in the classrooms. PAC is thrilled that it could help Laronde satisfy this critical need so that each and every child in the classroom has access to technology-based activities.

(6) <u>Screenagers</u> – PAC provided funding for the **newly updated** film, <u>Screenagers</u>: <u>Growing up in the Digital Ag</u>. Award-winning and thought-provoking, the film is now more relevant than ever with its recent update for 2025, including fresh insights from **Jonathan Haidt**, author of <u>The Anxious Generation</u>, and several others. The update also includes the latest scientific findings on the effects of video gaming, sleep, social media, and the use of phones and smartwatches in schools.

Book Exchange. A big THANK YOU to Cynthia Springate and all the volunteers who made this event possible this year! It was a spectacular success with children rushing to get in the gym to find their favorite authors or series. Not only did our Laronde children benefit from this event, but we were able to donate approximate 15 boxes of books to our sister school Forsythe Elementary after all was said and done. This event was enjoyed by all, but we can't do it without volunteers. Next year, we will be looking for a volunteer or team to lead this event. We hope you will consider being a part of it.

Playground Funding. As many of you know, playgrounds are not paid for by the school, the city, the district, or the province. Rather, it is the responsibility of PAC (all of us), and/or private donations to fund the building, repair and replacement of all playgrounds at our school. This is a substantial financial cost which funds cannot be generated in the short-term. Therefore, the PAC executives from previous years have had the foresight and long-term vision to plan, save, and allocate funding in a way which will ensure that we have the financial capability to repair and/or replace our playgrounds when deemed expired/necessary by the district. We are fortunate to have three playgrounds for our children. According to the district, there will be need for replacement of one of our playgrounds in the next 5-6 years. Therefore, we will endeavor to have these funds available so that Laronde families and our community can continue to enjoy the benefits playgrounds bring. But, in the event of unforeseen damage, vandalism, etc., it is assuring to know PAC is reasonably prepared for such contingencies.

There were concerns expressed at the last general meeting that PAC had not clearly communicated whether, and what percentage of funds raised by the current Direct Donation Campaign would be allocated for <u>future</u> playground repair and/or replacement. We would like to address this by reiterating what was communicated in previous PAC minutes and Direct Donation Campaign letters that some portion of funds raised by the Direct Donation Campaign have been, and could be, used for playgrounds to be repaired and/or replaced.

We hope that Laronde families will take a moment to reflect on their child's first day of school. There was at least one playground for your child to play on during their very first recess. That playground was most likely paid for by funds raised by former Laronde parents who have since watched their children graduate from university. Being part of Laronde means being part of a community. And as a community, we lift each other up and we pay it forward!

At our annual general meeting on June 13th, we will approve the budget for the 2025/2026 school year. We encourage parents who have questions, and/or are interested in participating in the budget allocation and approval to attend this meeting.

Spirit Wear. Update from Julie Elliott. The Laronde PAC made over \$800 from the spirt wear campaign. Each year, PAC buys Laronde t-shirts for all of the kindergarten students. We purchase youth small shirts for kindergarten students. They are big but last a long time and makes them feel a part of Laronde immediately!
