Chair Report - Megan Johnson

Projects Funded by PAC. PAC has funded wonderful programs this year, including:

Vaisakhi – Samosas. PAC was proud to support Laronde's celebration of Vaisakhi on April 14th providing a samosa for each child. PAC will continue to contribute to the cultural enrichment and education of our kids and to recognize the very important cultural celebrations and events occurring throughout the year through food, art, music, dance, and literature.

Body Health Presentations - PAC sponsored the Body Health sessions presented by Saleema Noon in addition to paying for access to the content before the presentations in the classrooms. PAC hopes that by providing access to the videos, parents felt better informed and equipped to make decisions about their children(s)' participation.

Unique Minds Science Workshop: Unique Minds came to Laronde to give Science workshops to our students on topics such as space, machines, properties of light and sound, meteorology, and water. This was a great way for students to be exposed to some fun Science projects and learning and the teachers have the chance to see the interactions of students in their grade groups. This was funded by PAC's Science Enhancement Funds.

Saltwater Studios Art Program (Artists in Residence): PAC supported Johanne Howard from Saltwater Studios to come do these very popular workshops with our students of all ages. The kids really enjoyed this and look forward to it every year. Johanne brings her passion for art to the classroom, providing our kids the opportunity to find their artistic expression and creativity, which can fuel new passions and improve self-awareness and confidence. - (4) MOSAIC) PAC was thrilled to fund this important presentation by MOSAIC Centre for Diversity that focuses on building a school environment based on respect, equity, inclusion, and diversity. In the assembly, students explored ways people are different from each other, including racial and cultural differences; understand the meaning and negative impact of racism; and to understand and learn to recognize the signs and negative impact of racism.
- (5) <u>Technology (iPads)</u> PAC supplied the school with <u>11 iPads</u> to meet the remaining needs for technology in the classrooms. PAC is thrilled that it could help Laronde satisfy this critical need so that each and every child in the classroom has access to technology-based activities.
- (6) <u>Screenagers</u> PAC provided funding for the **newly updated** film, <u>Screenagers</u>: <u>Growing up in the Digital Age</u>. Award-winning and thought-provoking, the film is now more relevant than ever with its recent update for 2025, including fresh insights from **Jonathan Haidt**, author of <u>The Anxious Generation</u>, and several others. The update also includes the latest scientific findings on the effects of video gaming, sleep, social media, and the use of phones and smartwatches in schools.

GRADE 7 FUNDRAISING/COMMITTEE

Grade 7's enjoyed their last camp of the year on May 5th at Camp Jubilee – your support throughout this year has enabled our Grade 7's to build bonds and create memories at all 3 camps this year and to put money towards their Grad Party in June. Thank you so much!

Grade 7 Committee (2025/2026): Next year, our goal is to organize a formal "Grade 7 Committee" whose purpose will be to assist with the communication, planning, and fundraising efforts/events for the Grade 7 kids and their families. The Committee would also consist of a designated "Grade 7 Committee Representative" and a "Grade 7 Treasurer" decided by the committee who will liaise with the PAC Executive, attend PAC meetings, and provide regular updates, advise of any Grade 7 initiatives, and provide feedback from Grade 7 parents. Ideally, the Committee will be formed, and a representative will be chosen before the first day of school in September.

This committee is responsible for all fundraising efforts to assist in covering the cost of Grade 7 extended day camp(s) and the end-of-year Grad party. The party is a parent-run event with no involvement from the school. Without fundraising, the cost for camps and the party, would be out of pocket for each individual family, totaling approximately \$450 per student. We want continuity of fundraising information to be available to future Grade 7 committees; each Grad year may want to fundraise differently, but it can be valuable to have an example to start with.

Note: funds collected through School Cash Online or otherwise through the school (as opposed to through the PAC) cannot be used for the Party – something to keep in mind.

Grade 6 Fundraising/Committee Parent Representative (future Grade 7 parents) In addition to a Grade 7 Committee and Representative, this year, we found it helpful for the Grade 6 parents/kids to begin their fundraising efforts early to prepare for the costs of their Grade 7 activities/camps which start early in the year (October Camp). For example, this year, the Grade 6 kids/parents hosted the Holiday Pancake Breakfast, which was an enormously successful event, both in outcome, and as a fundraising activity. Going forward, the Grade 6 kids/parents will host this event to help them get the necessary head start for their fundraising.
