1. Welcome & Introduction

Welcome from Megan. Welcome everybody! 11 parents were in attendance including the following members of the Executive: Megan Johnson, Victor Chan, Elena Plotnik, Jin Thindal, Julie Elliot, Corrine Proctor, Lara Guelpa and Nishi Banipal. Principal Mme. Boudreau was also in attendance. Megan called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m.

Land Acknowledgement. The meeting opened with the acknowledgement that our school, where we work, play and learn is on the shared, unceded territory of the Katzie, Semiahmoo, Kwantlen and other Coast Salish Peoples.

Review of Code of Conduct. Megan reviewed an excerpt from our Constitution and Bylaws:

Code of conduct

- a. General meetings will be conducted with fairness to all members. The business of the council shall be unbiased towards race, religion, gender, politics, sexual orientation or social condition.
- b. At general meetings, members shall not discuss individual school personnel, students, parents or other members of the school community.
- c. The organization shall refrain from partisan political action or other activities, which do not serve the interests of the school or the public school system.

4. Principal's Report – Janesse Boudreau

Mr. Ablitt (previous band teacher) will be our new music teacher next year!

Spring Dance. This was an incredible experience for our students. A big thank you to Tracy Merry and Luana Foulkes for organizing and making this happen.

Welcome to Kindergarten. This event was held on June 5, 2025 and was a huge success. Thank you PAC for attending and presenting!

Parent Appreciation Day. This event was held on June 11. We hope everyone who was able to attend enjoyed the coffee, tea, treats, and all the performances.

Staff Appreciation Luncheon. Thank you so much for organizing! This is our opportunity to thank the wonderful teachers and staff at Laronde. The Luncheon was Tuesday, June 10. Staff loved it and thanks PAC!

Student Learning Plan (SLP). Mme Boudreau & Mme Shakur are working on a SLP for Laronde. The plan will outline what we are working on at Laronde. There is a meeting planned with the Assistant Superintendent next week to go over our SLP. Once completed, it will be available at https://surreylearningbydesign.ca/student-learning-plans/

Some items that the SLP will focus on include:

- Focus on literacy, both written and oral French. Looking at ways to have students interact more with each other in French.
- Social/Emotional Learning. This is our third year with the Second Step program (social-emotional learning curriculum). It has been wonderful to see the students focusing on a growth mindset. The school has committed to do this program again next year!

National Indigenous Peoples Day. National Indigenous Peoples Day is on Saturday, June 21. This special day is dedicated to recognizing and celebrating the rich cultures, traditions, histories, and achievements of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Peoples across Canada and around the world. Since it falls on a Saturday this year, we will be celebrating it at school on **Monday, June 23rd**. To mark the occasion, our PAC has generously provided Bannock for all students and staff to enjoy. We look forward to this opportunity to honour and learn more about the diverse and vibrant cultures of Indigenous Peoples!

Swimming Field Trips. On Thursday, June 19, students from divisions 1 -11 will attend a field trip to Sunnyside Outdoor Pool.

Sports Day. We are excited for our annual Sport Days on Friday, June 20. All stations will be on the grass field and divided between Primary and Intermediate Groups. We will have 3 stations before recess, 3 after recess, and 3 after lunch. Colours: blue, green, black and white. Concession will be at 1:30 p.m.

Grade 7 Farewell Ceremony. This event will be held on Tuesday, June 24. A letter was sent out to all the parents on May 30 with all the details. Grade 7 Band will be performing at the ceremony.

Final Assembly. The assembly will be held on Thursday, June 26, at 9:15 am in the gym. The Grade 7's will perform their last band performance. Everyone is welcome to attend!

Last Day of School. The last day of school this year is Thursday, June 26. Students will be dismissed at 1:33 p.m. We will have our last hot lunch that day and teachers will send home report cards. The teachers will be at school on Friday, June 27, if you need to pick anything up.

Next School Year. We are heading into the 2025/2026 school year with 20 divisions. The numbers may change again closer to the start of school.

Grade 7 Band & Music Program Update. Please see the message below sent out to families.

Bonjour Laronde Families,

We understand how difficult and disappointing this news has been, not only for our school community but across the entire district. Unfortunately, we are one of many schools that will not be offering band next year. This decision is truly devastating, especially given the impact music has had on so many of our students. There have been many thoughtful suggestions on how to preserve the band program, whether during the school day or after school hours. However, for reasons of equity across all elementary schools, we are not able to offer an additional program at Laronde when it is not available at other schools.

We are very sad to see Mme Ziolkoski go and are so grateful for the passion and dedication she brought to our students. At the same time, we are thankful to welcome Mr. Ablitt as our new music teacher. While we are still finalizing what music programming will look like for each class next year, we are confident it will be a rich, joyful, and engaging experience for all.

Thank you for your understanding and ongoing support as we continue to prioritize meaningful and equitable learning experiences for every child.

5. Chair Report – Megan Johnson

Megan began her chair report by thanking the PAC executive for everything they do for the school and for taking a team-oriented approach. It made her first year as president much easier! Megan also acknowledged our amazing Principal, Mme. Boudreau, for being so collaborative with PAC and working alongside parents to make Laronde such a wonderful place for students. A BIG thank-you also to Cheryl and Natalie for everything you do our kids!

Projects Funded by PAC in the 2024/2025 school year. PAC has funded wonderful programs this school year, including:

<u>Vaisakhi – Samosas.</u> PAC was proud to support Laronde's celebration of Vaisakhi on April 14th providing a samosa for each child. PAC will continue to contribute to the cultural enrichment and education of our kids and to recognize the very important cultural celebrations and events occurring throughout the year through food, art, music, dance, and literature.

<u>Body Health Presentations</u>. PAC sponsored the Body Health sessions presented by Saleema Noon in addition to paying for access to the content before the presentations in the classrooms. PAC hopes that by providing access to the videos, parents felt better informed and equipped to make decisions about their children(s)' participation.

<u>Unique Minds Science Workshop.</u> Unique Minds came to Laronde to give Science workshops to our students on topics such as space, machines, properties of light and sound, meteorology, and water. This was a great way for students to be exposed to some fun Science projects and learning and the teachers have the chance to see the interactions of students in their grade groups. This was funded by PAC's Science Enhancement Funds.

<u>Saltwater Studios Art Program</u>. PAC supported Johanne Howard from Saltwater Studios to come do workshops with our students.

<u>Think Yourself for Kids Academy - Yoga week K-7</u>. This program was provided to the kids to promote physical literacy, self-esteem, and confidence. Ask your child about their experience! https://thinkyourself.com/school-kids-programs/

<u>MOSAIC</u>. PAC was thrilled to fund this important presentation by MOSAIC Centre for Diversity that focuses on building a school environment based on

respect, equity, inclusion, and diversity. In the assembly, students explored ways people are different from each other, including racial and cultural differences; understand the meaning and negative impact of racism; and to understand and learn to recognize the signs and negative impact of racism.

<u>Technology (iPads)</u>. PAC supplied the school with 11 iPads to meet the remaining needs for technology in the classrooms. PAC is thrilled that it could help Laronde satisfy this critical need so that every student in the classroom has access to technology-based activities.

<u>Screenagers</u>. PAC provided funding for the newly updated film, <u>Screenagers</u>: Growing up in the Digital Ag. Award-winning and thought-provoking, the film is now more relevant than ever with its recent update for 2025, including fresh insights from Jonathan Haidt, author of <u>The Anxious Generation</u>, and several others. The update also includes the latest scientific findings on the effects of video gaming, sleep, social media, and the use of phones and smartwatches in schools.

<u>EMS Scholarship.</u> Megan provided an update on the scholarship Laronde provides annually to an EMS graduate (must be a former Laronde student). This year we are proud to announce that Sofia Jamal was the winner of the \$1000 scholarship. Sofia has been accepted to UBC and wants to go into social work like her mom. She is also a theatre lover and is interested in learning how to incorporate art/dance/theatre to support children. Congratulations Sofia!

9. New Business:

Why is Camp Jubilee no longer an overnight event for students?

- Grade 7 students attended three day camps this year. The teachers have been happy with this change and feel more comfortable not taking the students away on an overnight trip.
- The day camps are school run events, but parents are welcome to plan a parent-led event after school hours (ex. a weekend away for grade 7

- families). This will be up to grade 7 parents and PAC will not be involved. This year, almost 50 families went to Whistler for a parent organized camping trip. Everyone had a wonderful time!
- Jin noted that the district is making a shift away from school organized overnight camps and there is more emphasis on parent planning/organization of these events.

Pancake Breakfast. This year, the grade 6 students and their families put on the annual pancake breakfast in December. Thank-you to Greg Lutz for all your efforts! We discussed whether it would make sense to have the grade 6 class put on the pancake breakfast again this year. It is a great opportunity for them to get started with fundraising.
