Projects Funded by PAC. PAC has already funded wonderful programs since the start of the school year. Below are just a few, with many more to come this year!

Fall 2025 Programs

<u>Unique Minds Science Workshop:</u> Unique Minds came to Laronde to give Science workshops to our students on topics such as space, machines, properties of light and sound, meteorology, and water. The kids learned about the following concepts:

Wsflash – Flash Bang workshop on the properties of light and sound: sources of intensity and interactions.

Wswhat – What's the Matter workshop on matter and states

Wsfinally – Finally fun workshops on forces and simple machines

Wserosion – workshop on local landforms and how they are affected by air, water, soil, and the sun.

Wsevolution – Evolution Revolution workshop on how living things have changed over time.

Wsedison – Edison's workshop on static and electricity.

Wssystems – All System's Go workshop on four vital human body systems.

This was a wonderful way for students to be exposed to some fun science projects and learning and the teachers have the chance to see the interactions of students in their grade groups. This was funded by PAC's Science Enhancement Funds.

<u>Saltwater Studios Art Program</u>: PAC supported Johanne Howard from Saltwater Studios to come do workshops with our students last year. The kids loved it and she is back this year already! Divisions 1-15 had workshops this month. The remaining divisions 16-20 will have the workshops in December



2024/25 Programs Last Year

<u>Think Yourself for Kids Academy - Yoga week K-7:</u> This program was provided to the kids to promote physical literacy, self-esteem, and confidence. This was hugely popular!

<u>MOSAIC</u>) PAC was thrilled to fund this important presentation by MOSAIC Centre for Diversity that focuses on building a school environment based on respect, equity, inclusion, and diversity.

<u>Technology (iPads)</u> – PAC supplied the school with <u>11 iPads</u> last year to meet the remaining needs for technology in the classrooms.

PAC's biggest fundraiser of the year is the Direct Donation Campaign. OUTREACH COMMITTEE



Nikki and Michelle (both grade 2 moms) are in their third year as co-chairs of the PAC's Outreach Committee, and do a tremendous job organizing, planning, and executing the Outreach programs. The Outreach Committee organizes two major events each year, the first is the Warm Clothing Drive at the end of October and the second is the Christmas Hamper program in December.

During the Warm Clothing Drive, the Outreach Committee reaches out to the Laronde Community to collect new and gently used, warm weather clothing in good condition for distribution at our sister school in North Surrey - Forsyth Road Elementary. More information to come.

Christmas Hamper Program

The Christmas Hamper program is another wonderful program we run with Forsyth Elementary. Every year, Forsyth Elementary invites families from their school to apply for a Christmas Hamper. They select families based on the level of need and make efforts to select families that will not be receiving a Christmas Hamper through any other program. Laronde will usually receive a list of approximately 10 families. Those families are assigned to different classrooms and the whole Laronde community comes together to purchase food for the families and gifts for the children (trying to keep in mind any specific requests from the families). This year, the Christmas Hamper program will likely run the first two weeks of December, similar to last year. However, this year the list of gifts being collected will be reduced to continue supporting the same number of families while ensuring every family benefits from the wonderful generosity of the Laronde community.

Other events and how to volunteer

Last year, the Outreach Committee supported the Grade 7s in running a canned food drive and hopes to support the Surrey Food Drive again this year.
